Negotiations Update - Brian Greene

Thank you to everyone who completed the survey on potential reopener items we ran recently. In addition to using your input to shape our approach to negotiations, the feedback offers a wealth of comments and concerns that are useful topic ideas for upcoming education and communication efforts. Keep an eye out in this space and elsewhere for more information.

The primary purpose of the survey was to help guide negotiations this round and finalize our reopener to the District. We subsequently submitted our 2025-26 initial proposals last Wednesday and expect them to be agendized for the October board meeting. We understand that the District expects to complete its obligations to start this round of negotiations at the November meeting, with the two teams hopefully meeting shortly thereafter.

As mentioned in the survey, many of the items being negotiated this round were already set through previous agreements, and include such topics as the evaluation process, lab parity, part-time faculty rehire rights, and both full- and part-time health benefits. In addition, we will be negotiating compensation, banked leave, and some MOUs that are approaching their expiration. If you have additional thoughts about any of the items being negotiated, either now or down the road, I encourage you to share them with your YFA Representative(s) so they can be brought forward to the Rep Council.
